The fund invests predominantly in equities of corporations domiciled in the People's Republic of China or companies that derive the majority of their revenues or profits from Chinese operations or have a significant proportion of their assets there. This may include equities that are listed domestically or overseas or investment in companies with Variable Interest Entity (VIE) structures to gain exposure to industries with foreign ownership restrictions. The fund is actively managed by our investment team, who will select stocks to try to take advantage of opportunities they have identified.
